**I.
ORDER IDENTIFYING PARTIES**

On February 26, 2001, this Court issued an *Order Requiring Parties of Record to File a Notice of Intent to Remain in Consolidated Subcases*. Parties were given until 5 pm on March 9, 2001, to file their notices of intent. The following parties timely filed notices of intent and are identified by this Court as the only parties currently of record to the above-captioned consolidated subcase:

All other parties previously of record will be deemed withdrawn from the consolidated subcase and their names will be removed from the Certificate of Mailing for the matter. Parties with pending motions to participate or file late objections will be added pursuant to the outcome of their motion(s).

II. FIRST SCHEDULING AND CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER SETTING DEADLINES

On February 20, 2001, a preliminary scheduling and status conference was held to discuss scheduling matters for case management of the consolidated subcase. The following shall apply:

April 10, 2001

The notice of hearing went out by separate order.

May 1, 2001

Deadline for submitting names of potential settlement moderator or stipulation as to settlement moderator and agreement as to compensation: If parties cannot stipulate to a moderator, then each party shall file with the Court a list of at least three potential moderators together with attached credentials. The Court will select a moderator from the lists submitted. Following selection of a settlement moderator, the Court will order an initial mandatory settlement conference.

The Court reserves the right to have ex parte interviews with proposed moderators on all issues the Court deems important.

December 3, 2001

Deadline for the United States to file amended Notices of Claim.

December 18, 2001

Status and scheduling conference.

Separate notice of this hearing will not issue. Following this conference, the Court will issue an order setting time for parties to respond to amended claims, discovery and motion cut-off dates, pre-trial conference and trial date.

Spring 2003

Tentative trial setting: The Court is tentatively looking at a trial setting in the Spring 2003. Recognizing that fieldwork is limited to the spring and summer seasons, the parties should govern requisite fieldwork and data collection accordingly.
